B. Topics**1. Review of the April 20, 2021 Agenda Items**

A review and discussion of the Tuesday, April 20, 2021 regular meeting agenda occurred.

2. ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund)

President Biden signed a \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan into law in March, 2021. Copley-Fairlawn City School District is expected to receive \$1.9 million from this federal stimulus package. Mr. Wheadon, Treasurer, said the funds will be used to supplant items such a technology, busses, additional mental health services, virtual learning, and sanitizing supplies and equipment.

3. Natatorium Upgrades

The natatorium scoreboard is in need of replacement. Three proposals were received ranging from around \$21,000 to \$54,000. There have been donations received to apply toward the purchase. Further research will be done on each scoreboard and determine which would be best and the amount of donations necessary.

4. Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) – Vacation

Administration plans to reach out to Teamsters Local #348 regarding a MOU on vacation leave similar to last year. During the pandemic less vacation time has been utilized and instead of employees having to forfeit their days, they will be paid for unused days. It is important for the custodians to be at work daily to sanitize the buildings properly.
