D. Recognition of the Public

The Copley-Fairlawn City School District Board of Education feels that while public participation in Board meetings is not required, it is a valuable way to receive input from community members. The Board will not enter into debate or discussion on any matter brought forward, instead the information will be forwarded to the proper individual for possible follow up. Those who wish to participate in the public comments section of the agenda must sign in on the sheet available at the entrance to the meeting. Those signed up to address the Board should limit their comments to a maximum of three minutes until the total time of 30 minutes is used according to Policy BDDH (Also KD) and Ohio Revised Code 121.22 and 3313.20.

Lori Dos, grandmother of a kindergartner, 4th grader and 6th grader, requested that the Board of Education make masks optional for the 2021-2022 school year. She also requested that the Board of Education not entertain Critical Race Theory and the 1619 Project. Finally, she praised teachers and the principal at Arrowhead Primary School for their dedication and hard work.

5. Resolution and Date for the Designation of Depositories

Adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Sections 135.01 through 135.21 of the Ohio Revised Code, constituting the “Uniform Depository Act” govern the deposit of all public moneys of this Board, and

WHEREAS, the present depository designations of this Board expire as of midnight August 23, 2021, and

WHEREAS, estimates of the probable amounts of public moneys to be deposited in eligible public depositories should be made by this Board preceding the designation of public depositories, and

WHEREAS, this Board must designate public depositories for the period August

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24, 2021 to and including August 23, 2026, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Copley-Fairlawn City School District, authorizes the Treasurer to designate public depositories and award the active and interim public moneys to and among such designated depositories for the period August 24, 2021 to and including August 23, 2026, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is estimated that the aggregate maximum amount of its active, interim, and/or inactive deposits of public moneys at any time during the period of designation will be twenty five million dollars (\$25,000,000), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such banks and institutions as shall be eligible to become public depositories for this Board shall make application in writing to this Board for such active and interim public deposits as they desire to receive and have on deposit at any time, and that:

- a. each application shall be accompanied by a financial statement meeting the requirements of Section 135.06 of the Ohio Revised Code
- b. the only security to be furnished by public depositories for the repayment of public moneys under the control of this Board shall be securities listed in Sections 135.18 and 135.181 of the Ohio Revised Code.
