B. Recognmtion ofth Public

The Copley-Fairlawn City School District Board of Education feels that while public participation in Board meetings is not required, it is a valuable way to receive input from community members. He said vouchers are designed to kill public education. He would hope the school board would stand up for public education unconditionally and become members of coalitions with the same mission.
