Math – Complete the attached “Today’s Number Paper”.

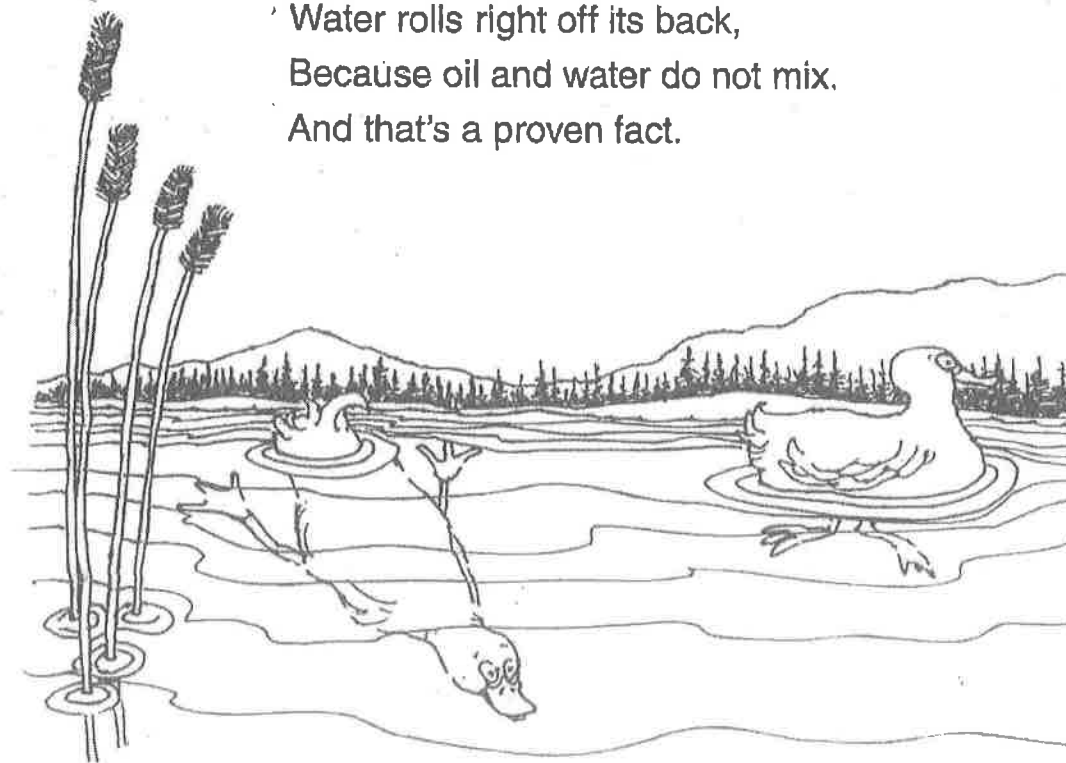
Ducks Don't Get Wet

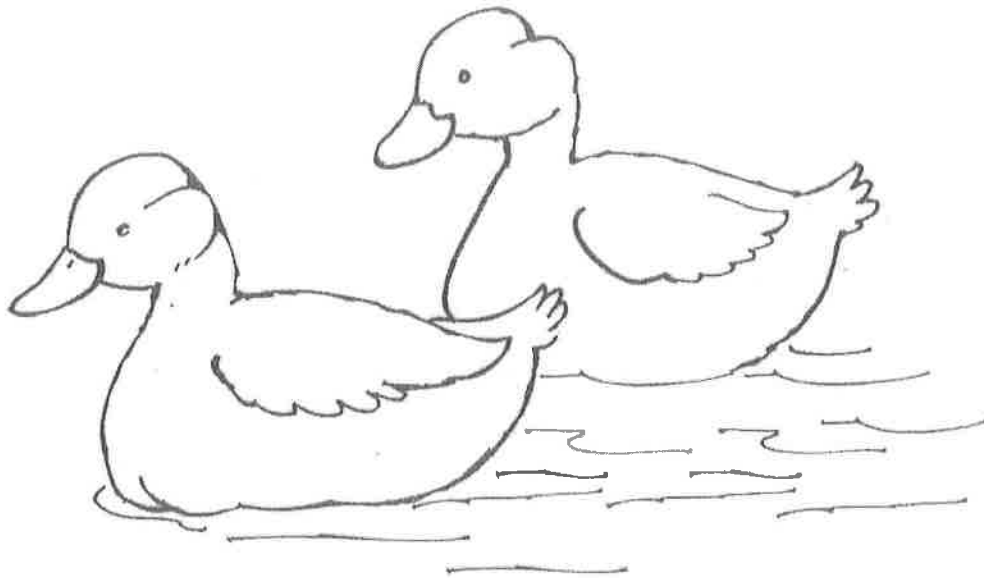

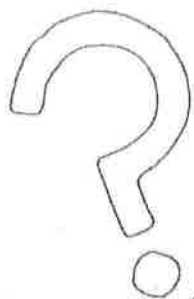
