Securly24 – 24 hour monitoring of chromebook activity from 3rd party of trained analysts – 47 incidents this year so far. Alerts come via text message or email and receive about 9 minutes later...goes to building admins and Copley police dept. The police can get an officer over to the house immediately for a wellness check. This helped us get students the support they need if we weren't notified in this way.

SecurlyHome app is a new way for parents to monitor and control their chromebook activity – offers parents ability to view online activity. Parents can setup rules for what they cannot view and it can balance the time online. You can turn the internet off on their device.

Parent preview signup form to test the program for the month of May only on their chromebooks.

Superintendent – Brian Poe: Art show was an incredible turnout, thank you for all our efforts. Lock down and safety drill Susan is taking the lead on the volunteer training in September.

Facility improvements – impact group on how to communicate with family and communities. Concerns with cost overruns \$50 million is a target and might need to estimate more. Bids are coming in over budget with is consistent with industry.

Mental Health issues – expanding social work services at the HS. 2 new 3rd parties brought in to help and things can be run through insurance. Will be ready in the fall for next school year.
